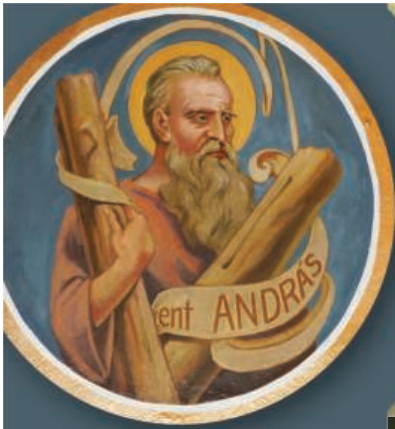

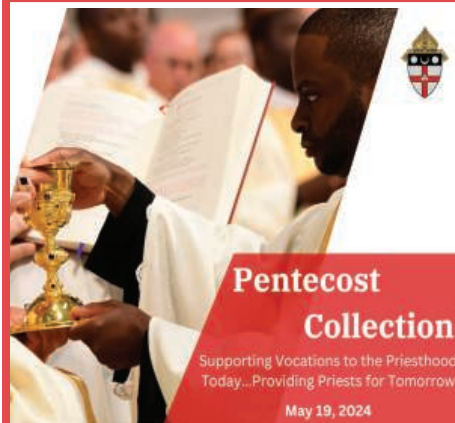

Sunday, May 5, 2024

The Sixth Sunday of Easter

Acts 10:25-26, 34-35, 44-48; 1 Jn 4:7-10; Jn 15:9-17



Today's readings speak of how God befriends humanity and shows no partiality.

In the verses previous to today's reading from Acts, Peter struggles with this new insight. Three times God speaks to him in a vision, so that he is able to say to Cornelius, "In truth, I see that God shows no partiality." Even as Peter is speaking and still trying to grasp the implications of this, the Holy Spirit preempts any further attempts at explanation, and in the divine erratic, inexplicable way, falls upon all without distinction. As Peter rightly asserts, those who consider themselves already to be God's best friends must not put obstacles in the way of others upon whom the Spirit falls. Like a parent who loves each child differently yet equally, so is the divine embrace.

John's Gospel uses the term *disciple* more than seventy times to refer to all the women and men who believed in and followed Jesus. John includes no scene of choosing or sending the Twelve, no do the Twelve figure in any prominent way in the narrative. They are mentioned only in passing at 6:67, 70; 20:24.

In today's gospel reading, Jesus speaks of having chosen and befriended all who have remained with him. The offer of friendship to disciples is part of a chain of love that begins with the Father, whose love is poured out in the self-gift that is Jesus, who offers friendship to all. Jesus then tells his friends how to keep that chain unbroken: pay the love forward to others, befriending them in the way that he has done for them. He speaks of this as a "commandment," which seems an odd term in this context. How can one be commanded to "love" another person? In biblical parlance, "love" signifies not so much feelings one has toward another. Rather, it designates deeds of loving kindness toward another that communicate to that one that they are part of the community of chosen friends of God and Jesus. We are commanded to act this way toward others, no matter how we might feel about them and whether or not they reciprocate the love offered.

Jesus demonstrated what such love entails when he washed the feet of all "his own" (13:1), the many beloved friends gathered for their final meal with him. He did not skip Peter and Judas. He explains this as the greatest kind of love: willingness to lay down one's life for one's friends. This is not an obligatory service, such as a slave is bound to render. Rather, the love of friendship is freely chosen self-surrender. The most challenging aspect of this kind of love is that the friends of Jesus are asked not only to embrace within the community of beloved disciples all those whom Jesus befriends, especially those to whom we are not naturally drawn, but even to be willing to risk our own lives for such people. When this seems a humanly impossible choice, Jesus assures disciples that when they ask God in his name, the necessary grace will be given.

Daily Readings & Reflections

Monday, May 6, 2024 Easter Weekday

Acts 16:11-15; John 15:26-16:4a

God has bestowed so many gifts on creation. In fact, the world is here in the first place because God's love overflowed—God wanted to share the divine love. God even sent Jesus and became human so as to invite people more deeply into life in God. So shouldn't the response to all this generosity be a generous one in which we welcome God into our lives, are open and inviting with God in prayer, and honor and care for our world and its creatures? Start opening doors today.

Tuesday, May 7, 2024 Easter Weekday

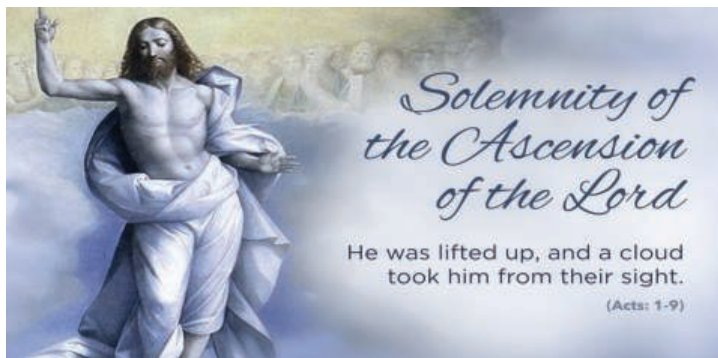
Acts 16:22-34; John 16:5-11

Much has been written about the importance of a "ministry of presence"—of being with people in times of need. Important as presence is, there is also a "ministry of absence," said noted spirituality author Henri Nouwen. We should never forget that it is the Holy Spirit ultimately who brings healing and comfort to people and that we need to trust God to do the work that only God can do in human hearts. There came a time when the risen Christ had to depart, but with assurances the Holy Spirit would be with us always. Sometimes your absence serves in a way your presence can't.

Wednesday, May 8, 2024 Easter Weekday

Acts 17:15, 22-18:1; John 16:12-15

Often in stories of the church, both ancient and modern, you hear in the headlines about the scoffers. The anonymous faithful are relegated to the margins and the footnotes. "Is God dead?" the cover of Time magazine inquired funereally in bold red letters on a stark black background in 1966. It would hardly make the back page to reply: Not in the hearts and lives of believers. The pages of the New Testament are sprinkled liberally with folks who encountered Jesus or the apostles and came to faith. Good news travels quietly. Make a little noise with yours.



Thursday, May 9, 2024 The Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord—A Holy Day of Obligation

Acts 1:1-11; Ephesians 1:17-23 or 4:1-13; Mark 16:15-20

Signs are not destinations. They may assist us in getting where we're going, tell how far we've come or what to do next, but they're not intended to be goals in themselves. Early Christians viewed certain signs as indicators of spiritual authority: the ability to heal, inspired speech, command of dark forces, or facing dangers without harm. Saint Paul warned us not to become enchanted with power for its own sake. Instead, we should consider the needs of the community and how best to serve. Name some modern signs that someone is demonstrating with genuine spiritual authority.



Friday, May 10, 2024 Easter Weekday

*Saint Damien de Veuster, Priest
Acts 18:9-18; John 16:12-15*

His brother Pamphile was the big shot: older, brilliant, slated for greatness in the mission fields. But when Pamphile fell ill at the

time the Sacred Hearts were sending priests to the Hawaiian missions, the younger Damien volunteered to take his place. No one put much confidence in Damien, who had no brain for book-learning, questionable social skills, and no patience at all with authority. What Damien did among those afflicted with leprosy at Molokai far outweighed any of his limitations. Let your love be bigger than your limitations!

Saturday, May 11, 2024 Easter Weekday

Acts 18:23-28; John 16:23b-28

Tradition has it that Saint Gregory the Great heard angels chanting the first three lines of the Marian antiphon, Regina Caeli, on Easter morning. "Joy to you, O Queen of Heaven. / The One you were worthy to bear / has risen as he said. / Pray for us to God," with each line followed by "Alleluia!" That last word—Hebrew for "praise God!"—even sounds joyous, especially after not hearing it all of Lent. Pulled out your rosary lately? Let Mary share with you her exultation, and let a joyous mood wash over you today, for others' sake.
